### Page 1 of 5 Important Information Prior to Travelling to The United Kingdom Tourist Entry Requirements Current DFAT Travel Advice

Australian ordinary passport holders usually do not require a visa to enter the United Kingdom (UK) for a period of up to 180 days for tourist or business purposes, provided that they have not previously been refused entry to Britain and do not have a criminal record. Those wishing to stay longer than 180 days, intending to marry, study or seeking employment will be required to obtain a visa. For further information on applying for a visa, please see the VFS Global website on the details below. Passports are recommended to be valid for six months beyond the period of intended stay. Travellers should also be able to show documentation confirming their ability to financially maintain themselves during their stay, as well as tickets and entry documents for their next destination.

Additional conditions may apply to minors. Travellers are recommended to contact a UK representative on the details below for further information and to ensure that their specific circumstances make them eligible to enter the UK without a visa.

### Vaccinations and Health Precautions

The following information is intended as a guide only and in no way should it be used as a substitute for professional medical advice relative to a travellers individual needs and vaccination history. Frequent travellers or those intending an extended stay overseas may consider vaccination against hepatitis B. Regardless of destination, all travellers should be up-to-date with their routine "background" vaccinations, including a recent annual influenza vaccination. Please consult a medical practitioner or contact The Travel Doctor for your specific risk to preventable diseases and the appropriate avoidance measures.

Australians in the United Kingdom may be eligible to access subsidised health care as part of the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement (RHCA) between the two countries. To take advantage of this program, travellers should visit a doctor or outpatient section of a public hospital who are prepared to treat them as a National Health Service (NHS) patient. Australians must be able to present their Australian Passport and Medicare card, and advise medical staff that they wish to be treated under the RHCA. Australians travelling to the United Kingdom should ensure that they have adequate travel insurance to cover the length of their stay. Time differences between the United Kingdom and Australia

The UK is Greenwich Mean Time +0 hours (+1 during daylight saving). The applicable time zones are Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) or British Summer Time (BST/BDT). Daylight saving is observed from the last weekend in March to the last weekend in October.

UK, 12 noon, Winter (Dec) = Perth 8pm, Darwin 9:30pm, Brisbane 10pm, Adelaide 10:30pm, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 11pm.
UK, 12 noon, Summer (Jun) = Perth 7pm, Darwin, Adelaide 8:30pm, Brisbane, Hobart, Melbourne, Sydney 9pm.

### Duty Free Allowances

Allowances when entering the UK from a non EU state:

Alcohol: 1 L spirits (>22% alc vol) or 2 L other beverages; as well as 4 L of still wine and 16 L of beer.  
Tobacco: 200 cigarettes or 50 cigars or 250 g of tobacco.  
Other Goods: Up to a value of £390.

Allowances when entering Australia:

Alcohol: 2.25 L.  
Tobacco: 50 cigarettes or 50g of tobacco.  
Other Goods: Up to a value of \$900 (\$450 if under 18 years).


Minors may not claim alcohol or tobacco products. Further restrictions apply when entering/exiting the UK and Australia. Travellers are encouraged to familiarise themselves with these restrictions before crossing the borders of either country. ### Electrical Adaptors and Voltage

Electrical socket: British (type G).

Supply: 230 V, 50 Hz (same as Australia).

A voltage converter is not usually required to use appliances designed for Australian use. A socket converter is generally all that is required for these appliances.



### Driving in the United Kingdom

Persons who hold a full and valid Australian drivers licence who are visiting the United Kingdom are usually permitted to drive any small vehicle that is shown on their licence, such as cars and or motorcycles.



This only applies for a period of 12 months from the date of entering the United Kingdom.

### Page 4 of 5 United Kingdom Currency Information and Cheat Sheet Exchange Rate Purchasing Power Parity

#### Interbank Rate

\$1 Australian Dollar (AUD) = £0.53 British Pounds  
£1 British Pound (GBP) = \$1.87 Australian Dollars

#### With 4% Margin

\$1 Australian Dollar (AUD) will buy £0.51 British Pounds  
£1 British Pound (GBP) will cost \$1.95 Australian Dollars

All rates were correct at a point in time on Tuesday, 12 Apr 2016. The "Interbank Rate" does not take into account any exchange fees, while the "With 4% Margin" adds 4% to the exchange rate to simulate a typical margin that would be paid when exchanging these currencies. These currency rates have been rounded and should not be used when calculating transactions of large value.

The following is a purchasing-power comparison of the British Pound and the Australian Dollar, using the Big Mac as a common good. While it does not present a faultless comparison, it is a useful indicator of the purchasing power of each currency.

Big Mac Australia: \$5.30 (AUD) = £2.83 British Pounds  
Big Mac UK: £2.89 (GBP) = \$5.41 Australian Dollars

*A Big Mac in the United Kingdom is therefore 2% more expensive than in Australia.*

This comparison is based on 2015 prices using current exchange rates. Prices may not include variations by locality or local taxes.

### Notes and Coins of the United Kingdom

The legal currency of the United Kingdom is the Pound Sterling (plural pounds), which is abbreviated using the symbol £. The subunit of the pound is the penny (plural pence or p), of which there are 100 in every pound. There are several forms of notes and coins in the United Kingdom, including those issued in crown dependencies, Scotland and Northern Ireland. The most common notes are those issued by the Bank of England, most of which appear below. Pictures are not to scale. As it is illegal in many countries to print copies of bank notes, travellers are advised to remove the below images prior to travelling.

Full Name: United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Size: 243,610 sq km (similar to Victoria).

Population: 63 million. England 53 mil, Scotland 5.3 mil, Wales 3.1 mil, Northern Ireland 1.8 mil. London 10 mil, Manchester 2.6 mil, Birmingham 2.4 mil, Glasgow 1.2 mil.

Ethnicity: White 87%, Black 3%, Indian 2.3%, Pakistani 1.9%.

Language: English, regional languages recognised including Scots, Scots Gaelic, Welsh, Irish and Cornish.

Religion: Christian 60%, Muslim 4.4%, Hindu 1.6%, none 26%.

GDP PC: US\$37,700 (Australia US\$46,600).

### Significant Dates:

- 2000 BC - Stonehenge is completed.
- 46 AD - Romans invade and rule Britain until 410 AD, they found London, build roads and introduce Christianity.
- 449 - Anglo-Saxons invade and conquer most of modern day England.
- 793 - First of many Viking raids on Britain.
- 1066 - Battle of Hastings, Normans from France defeat the Saxons. William the Conqueror becomes king.
- 1215 - King John signs the Magna Carter.
- 1282 - Wales is conquered by England.
- 1348-49 - Plague kills 1/3 of the population.
